Admission Requirements

Program Eligibility

- Postsecondary diploma, advanced diploma or degree.
- or
- Demonstrated competence through related work and/or educational experience.

Supplemental Requirement

Applicants applying without a postsecondary diploma or degree are required to complete a supplemental requirement. The Office of the Registrar will update your application in the Sheridan Application Portal to notify you if a portfolio is required.

Applicant Selection

Candidates to the program are selected on the basis of academic achievement.

Domestic applicants with education outside of Canada must have their transcripts assessed for equivalency through ICAS or WES. A general (document-by-document) or a comprehensive (course-by-course) assessment is required. There may be exceptions as determined by the college.

Applicants who do not meet the admission requirements for this program may be advised individually regarding other related programs.

English Language Proficiency

All applicants whose first language is not English must meet Sheridan's English Proficiency Requirements.
