Each year of the program includes field and/or clinical work. You'll also have an opportunity to participate in a 14-week internship between Years 3 and 4.

Admission requirements

Program eligibility

Ontario Secondary School Diploma or equivalent, including the following required courses:

- English, Grade 12 (ENG4U) with a minimum grade of 65%

plus

- Biology, Grade 12 (U) with a minimum grade of 65%

plus one of:

- Physics, Grade 12 (U) with a minimum grade of 65% or
- Mathematics, Grade 12 (U) with a minimum grade of 65% or
- Chemistry, Grade 12 (U) with a minimum grade of 65%

plus

- Three additional Grade 12 credits at the U or M level with a minimum grade of 65% in each course.

Or

Two semesters of postsecondary education plus all required courses listed above or equivalent with a minimum grade of 65% in each of the required courses.

Applicant selection

Eligible applicants will be selected on the basis of their previous academic achievement (the average of their six highest senior-level credits, including required courses).

Applicants who do not meet the admission requirements for this program may be advised individually regarding other related programs.

English language proficiency

All applicants whose first language is not English must meet Sheridan's English Proficiency Requirements.
