Admission Requirements

Program Eligibility

Ontario Secondary School Diploma or equivalent, including these required courses:

- English, Grade 12 (ENG4U)

PLUS

- Five other Grade 12 subjects (U or M level)
- Minimum 65% overall average

OR

Two semesters of postsecondary education, including English ENG4U or equivalent at a minimum 65% and a minimum 60% in remaining courses with a minimum overall average of 65%.

Statement of Intent

Applicants are required to submit a Statement of Intent. The detailed requirements including submission instructions and due date will be posted in your Sheridan Application Portal. Please note that there is an assessment fee.

Sample Statement of Intent submission instructions for reference purposes only are also available.

Applicant Selection

Eligible applicants are selected based on previous academic achievement (the average of their six highest senior-level credits, including the required courses listed above), plus the results of their Statement of Intent submission.

Applicants who do not meet the admission requirements for this program may be advised individually regarding other related programs.

English Language Proficiency

All applicants whose first language is not English must meet Sheridan's English proficiency requirements.
