Admission requirements

Program eligibility

Ontario Secondary School Diploma or equivalent, including these required courses:

• English, Grade 12 (ENG4U)

plus

- One Visual Arts credit (Grade 11 or 12 U, M or O level or postsecondary credit course)
- Four other Grade 12 subjects (U or M level)
- Minimum 65% overall average

or

• Two semesters of postsecondary education, including required English ENG4U or equivalent and Visual Arts course listed above with a minimum 65% overall average

Applicant selection

Eligible applicants are selected based on previous academic achievement (the average of their six highest senior-level credits, including the required courses listed above).

Applicants who do not meet the admission requirements for this program may be advised individually regarding other related programs.

English language proficiency

All applicants whose first language is not English must meet Sheridan's English proficiency requirements.
