Apply your learning in a studio-based environment that mirrors the process of creative industry: pitching ideas, user testing, ideation and creating real-world projects to build your portfolio. You'll work with the same tools used by leading designers, including: Figma, Adobe Creative Cloud, Unity, microcontrollers, AR/VR systems, sensors, wearables, 3D printers, digital fabrication and artificial Intelligence.

Admission requirements

Program eligibility

Ontario Secondary School Diploma or equivalent, including these required courses:

- English, Grade 12 (ENG4U)

plus

- One Visual Arts or Communication Technology (TGJ or TGG) credit (Grade 11 or 12 any level, workplace 'E' level not accepted), or one postsecondary Visual Arts credit course
- Four other Grade 12 subjects (U or M level)
- Minimum 65% overall average

or

- Two semesters of postsecondary education, including required English ENG4U or equivalent and Visual Arts course listed above with a minimum 65% overall average

Applicant selection

Eligible applicants are selected based on previous academic achievement (the average of their six highest senior-level credits, including the required courses listed above).

Applicants who do not meet the admission requirements for this program may be advised individually regarding other related programs.

English language proficiency

All applicants whose first language is not English must meet Sheridan's English proficiency requirements.
