Admission requirements

Program eligibility

- Postsecondary degree in the fields of psychology, sociology, social studies or child studies.

OR

- Postsecondary 2-year or 3-year diploma in the fields of child studies, social service worker, educational support, child and youth care or community development.

OR

- Postsecondary degree or diploma in a field not listed above. Applicants are required to submit documentation confirming demonstrated experience of volunteer and/or paid working hours in early learning (daycares and school ages zero to six years), validated by a Registered Early Childhood Educator (RECE).

Applicant selection

Eligible applicants will be selected based on previous academic achievement and/or demonstrated experience.

Applicants with an unrelated diploma or degree will be asked to submit additional information to determine eligibility:

- Applicants with work/volunteer experience in an Ontario public school board (for example, working as an Educational Assistant or Educational Resource Worker), will be asked to submit Sheridan forms confirming they have completed at least 120 hours of volunteer and/or paid work in early learning (daycares and school ages zero to six years). These forms must be validated by a Registered Early Childhood Educator (RECE) supervisor.
- Applicants without Ontario school board experience must prove understanding of Ontario's early childhood curriculum and pedagogy. These applicants will be asked to submit a résumé, questionnaire, and employer-signed form (provided by Sheridan) verifying a minimum of one year of relevant experience working with young children aged three months to six years, as an Educational Assistant or Educational Resource Worker, within the past five years.

The Office of the Registrar will update your application in the Sheridan Application Portal to notify you if this documentation is required. Specific forms, requirements and details on how to submit your documentation will be provided. Early Childhood Education - Intensive is a competitive program, and seats fill quickly. It's in your best interest to submit the documents as soon as possible, if required.

Applicants who do not meet the admission requirements for this program may be advised individually regarding other related programs.

English language proficiency

All applicants whose first language is not English must meet Sheridan's English proficiency requirements.
