# Admission requirements

## Program eligibility

- Postsecondary degree or 2- or 3-year diploma, or
- Demonstrated competence through related work and/or educational experience (for example, working as an Educational Assistant or Educational Resource Worker for an Ontario public school board), and/or life experience (for example, parenting a school-aged child with a disability).

Note: The Educational Support student must have the energy and stamina to respond to the physical demands associated with the role of the assistant.

## Applicant selection

Eligible applicants will be selected on the basis of previous academic achievement and related courses, and/or demonstrated experience.

Applicants applying through demonstrated competence may be asked to submit documentation confirming demonstrated experience. The Office of the Registrar will update your application in the Sheridan Application Portal to notify you if validation documentation is required.

Applicants who do not meet the admission requirements for this program may be advised individually regarding other related programs.

## English language proficiency

All applicants whose first language is not English must meet Sheridan's English proficiency requirements.

## Domestic applicants

- Postsecondary transcripts indicating courses completed to date must be submitted to [ontariocolleges.ca](https://ontariocolleges.ca) at the time of application.
- Domestic applicants with education outside of Canada must have their transcripts assessed for equivalency through ICAS or WES. A general credential evaluation is required.
- Private career college courses and/or credentials are not acceptable as admission requirements for Sheridan programs.

## Field placement requirements

Students will be required to provide additional documentation (such as criminal record checks and immunization records) directly to their field placement before the start of the placement and at their own expense. View Field Placement details for more information.
