

- have completed the TSSA Gas Technician 3 curriculum and may be eligible to write an exam for certification through the TSSA.
- be qualified to hook up furnaces, water heaters and other gas-fired appliances.

Admission requirements

Program eligibility

Ontario Secondary School Diploma or equivalent, with these required courses:

- One English, Grade 12 (ENG4C or ENG4U)
- One Math, Grade 11 or 12 (C, M or U)

Or

Mature student status.

Applicant selection

Eligible applicants are selected on the basis of their academic achievement (the average of their six highest senior-level credits, including required courses).

Applicants who do not meet the admission requirements for this program may be advised individually regarding other related programs.

English language proficiency

All applicants whose first language is not English must meet Sheridan's English proficiency requirements.
