Admission Requirements

Program Eligibility

Postsecondary diploma, advanced diploma or degree or equivalent in studies related to the "built environment" with a minimum overall GPA of 65%.

Applicant Selection

Candidates to the program are selected on the basis of academic achievement in a "built environment."

Individual applicants outside of the fields below will be selected on the basis of academic achievement and the evaluation of a Letter of Intent, which includes volunteer/work experience that demonstrates their interest in the industry.

Postsecondary transcripts, indicating courses completed to date, must be submitted to ontariocolleges.ca at the time of application. Domestic applicants with education outside of Canada must have their transcripts assessed for equivalency through ICAS or WES. A comprehensive (course-by-course) assessment is required.

Applicants who do not meet the admission requirements for this program may be advised individually regarding other related programs.

English Language Proficiency

All applicants whose first language is not English must meet Sheridan's English proficiency requirements.
