Admission requirements

Program eligibility

- Postsecondary diploma, advanced diploma or degree or equivalent in studies related to the "built environment" with a minimum overall GPA of 65%.

OR

- Demonstrated competence through a combination of academic achievement and the evaluation of a Letter of Intent.

Applicant selection

Eligible applicants are selected based on academic achievement in a "built environment."

Individual applicants outside of the fields identified will be selected based on academic achievement and the evaluation of a Letter of Intent, which includes volunteer/work experience that demonstrates your interest in the industry.

The Office of the Registrar will update your application in the Sheridan Application Portal to let you know if a Letter of Intent is required. Detailed instructions for what is required and how to submit will be provided.

Applicants who do not meet the admission requirements for this program may be advised individually regarding other related programs.

Those who do not have prior experience with drafting software may struggle particularly in the Urban Design Visualization stream of courses. Before starting this program, it is highly recommended that you familiarize yourself with the SketchUp software platform via third party learning options (e.g., LinkedIn Learning).

English language proficiency

All applicants whose first language is not English must meet Sheridan's English proficiency requirements.
