



| The Sheridan mace



For hundreds of years, postsecondary institutions around the world have used maces to symbolize dignity, sovereignty and authenticity. The Sheridan mace features three bent oak wood flutes (one for each campus) that flare out at the top to suggest Sheridan's future. Stainless steel rings that symbolize the College's faculties converge into a top segment representing a united Sheridan. Etched into the top is the iconic Sheridan S.

Traditionally, the Sheridan mace was carried in the academic procession and placed in its cradle on stage, signalling the start of Convocation. It's important to note, however, that prior to the mace being used in academic traditions, its historical origin as an instrument of violence and control — often within colonial and hierarchical systems — can carry unintended connotations. Given this historical context, some institutions, including Sheridan, are beginning to reflect more critically on the symbolism of the mace. These reflections are part of ongoing efforts to ensure that our traditions resonate with today's values of equity, inclusion and reconciliation.

| Tradition of the gown

The tradition of the gown began in the medieval universities of Europe. The practice became more widespread when gowns were established as the official dress of academics in the 14th century. Historians believe the long gowns may have been necessary for warmth in the unheated buildings used by medieval scholars or may reflect the strong ties that existed between academic and religious institutions.

Sheridan faculty in the procession today wear distinctive gowns that signify the institutions from which they graduated and the degrees they have earned. The gown for the baccalaureate degree typically has pointed sleeves, while the gown for the master's degree typically has longer, oblong sleeves. The gown representing a doctorate has large, full sleeves with three bars of velvet on each sleeve. Sheridan graduates wear royal blue gowns.

Office of Indigenous Engagement and Education

As a special honorary recognition, the Office of Indigenous Engagement and Education is proud to gift sweetgrass and a beaded thunderbird pin to Indigenous graduates. When used in ceremony, sweetgrass is often braided into three strands which represent mind, body and spirit. The braid is then tied in a knot, symbolizing the joining of these three aspects into one.

The logo on the thunderbird pin represents the Northwest Coast Thunderbird, and was designed by Madison Johns, an Indigenous student in Sheridan's Faculty of Animation, Arts & Design. The pin was beaded by Katie Chapman.

Katie is a mixed-Mohawk woman from the Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory and is a member of the Haudenosaunee Wolf Clan. Beading with purpose, her work embodies life. The thunderbird pins presented today represent power and strength for the Indigenous graduates.


