Selection Process for Applicants

Eligible applicants are selected on the basis of their academic achievement (in progress or completed) and portfolio submission (in the absence of a Grade 11 or 12 Visual Art Credit).

Applicants selected for the program will be notified through their Sheridan email account. These decisions will not be released over the phone. Fee, registration and timetable information will follow. Classes for the fall term begin Tuesday, September 8, 2026.

To move forward with the processing of your application you must submit a portfolio online. The online submission system will open November 2025. It's in your best interest to submit your portfolio as soon as possible, as seats in the program can fill quickly.

While there is not a specified due date, consider submitting your portfolio within 3 weeks from the date of applying to the program.

Academic Integrity

By submitting your Admission Requirements, you are agreeing to comply with Sheridan's Academic Integrity Policy. The Academic Integrity Policy states:

Sheridan College is committed to upholding the highest standards of academic integrity. The

International Centre for Academic Integrity (ICAI) defines academic integrity as “a commitment, even in the face of adversity, to six fundamental values: honesty, trust, fairness, respect, responsibility, and courage. From these values flow principles of behavior that enable academic communities to translate ideals into action”.

Applicants who are found to have falsified transcripts, cheated on admission tests, or submitted fraudulent documents or in any other way attempted to circumvent the admissions process in a manner inconsistent with the principles of academic integrity, will not be granted admission to the College. Those applicants will be ineligible for admission to any Sheridan program or course for a period of not less than 5 years, after which admission to the College will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

For programs where a portfolio submission is required as part of the admission process, portfolio work should represent an applicant's own ideas, writing, projects, and creations. Where others have contributed, or non-original ideas have been included, applicants will give proper recognition and reference.

Please introduce yourself and tell us why you want to explore interior design at Sheridan. Please describe the design intent behind your 1-5 creative pieces that you are sharing with us. Describe your design process, material selection, format/layout/assembly choices. We want to see what makes you passionate and brings joy into your life.

Please ensure this is presented in a professional manner.

CREATIVE WORK

Please show us 1-5 examples of your own original work that exemplifies your creativity. Creativity can be exhibited in many different ways. Please show us who you are as an artist, designer, performer, builder, technician, poet, writer, inventor, leader, activist, dreamer, business person or anyone who wants to explore interior design as a means to make the world a better and more beautiful place.

Examples could include, but are not limited to:

- Sketching, drawing, painting, photography, manual or digital drafting.
- 3-dimensional work (sculptures, models, built objects, renovated spaces).
- choreographed dance, composed a music piece, wrote a script and performed it.
- perhaps you started your own business, initiated a rally, etc.

We recognize and value unusual and artistic endeavours, as well as pragmatic, straightforward and technical interests. We recognize the importance of a student body that is diverse, unique, supportive and inspiring.
