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Selection Process for Applicants

Eligible applicants are selected on the basis of their academic achievement (in progress or completed) and [portfolio](#) submission.

Applicants selected for the program will be notified through their Sheridan email account. These decisions will not be released over the phone. Fee, registration and timetable information will follow. Classes for the fall term begin Tuesday, September 3, 2024.

To move forward with the processing of your application you must submit a portfolio online. The online submission system will open December 2023. It's in your best interest to submit your portfolio as soon as possible, as seats in the program can fill quickly.

Academic Integrity

By submitting your Admission Requirements, you are agreeing to comply with Sheridan's Academic Integrity Policy. The Academic Integrity Policy states:

Sheridan College is committed to upholding the highest standards of academic integrity. The International Centre for Academic Integrity (ICAI) defines academic integrity as "a commitment, even in the face of adversity, to six fundamental values: honesty, trust, fairness, respect, responsibility, and courage. From these values flow principles of behavior that enable academic communities to translate ideals into action".

Applicants who are found to have falsified transcripts, cheated on admission tests, or submitted fraudulent documents or in any other way attempted to circumvent the admissions process in a manner inconsistent with the principles of academic integrity, will not be granted admission to the College. Those applicants will be ineligible for admission to any Sheridan program or course for a period of not less than 5 years, after which admission to the College will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

For programs where a portfolio submission is required as part of the admission process, portfolio work should represent an applicant's own ideas, writing, projects, and creations. Where others have contributed, or non-original ideas have been included, applicants will give proper recognition and reference.

Additional Admission Requirements

Portfolio Requirements

You will need to submit a letter of intent and samples of work.

LETTER OF INTENT

Your letter of intent (PDF, maximum 300 words) must include the following:

- A narrative describing your awareness of the interior design profession and of leading/famous international and Canadian interior designers (not HGTV celebrities)
- Your goals as an Interior Designer
- An explanation of how Sheridan's Honours Bachelor of Interior Design program will help you achieve these goals
- Why you would be a good fit for this program

Please proof-read your letter. Correct grammar, spelling and overall structure are required.

SAMPLES OF WORK

Your samples must include 10 colour and/or black and white images of your original work that demonstrate your ability to be creative. A variety of work/media should be demonstrated in both your drawings and other pieces.

At least three of these MUST be drawings:

- The drawings can be of anything (life drawings, still lifes, portraits, nature, abstracts, etc.), but if you have drawings of interiors, architecture, details, etc., please show us (but we will teach you this).
- Sketches: we want to see that you can sketch by hand. Show us any sketches.
- If you have a sketchbook that you continually add to, show us some of that work. (If you love to explore ideas and the world by sketching, please show us).
- Any medium is good (pencil, pen, charcoal, etc.)

The other seven may include (but are not limited to):

- Paintings, printmaking, etc.
- Design work (graphic design, industrial design, crafts, furniture, textiles, ceramics, glass, fashion, engineering, murals, graffiti, etc.)
- Sculpture, architectural models, any 3-dimensional work, construction, etc.
- Photography
- Architectural drawings (manual drafting, CAD, SketchUP, Revit, etc.) (Not required; we will teach you this, but show us if you have experience)

Samples of Work – continued

- “Process of design” of any of your artwork, including preliminary sketches, discarded ideas, on-going editing of your work, etc., to show us how you “think” as a designer
- Or anything you feel may support your application for Interior Design

Please note that we will assess the “presentation” of your work in your portfolio, so please design and assemble your pages with pride, care, consistency, neatness, proper labels, etc. Although we will review each image individually, your overall Portfolio package is important to prepare.

Provide a description of each image included in your portfolio (i.e. date, medium, concept, etc.)

Please describe whether each art piece was a school project (please write the course name, the instructor, and a brief summary of the assignment requirements), or was created outside of school.

Image File Specifications:

- JPEG or PNG format only
- Maximum image file size is 5 MB (per file)

Additional Information
