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Academic Integrity

By submitting your Admission Requirements, you are agreeing to comply with Sheridan's Academic Integrity Policy. The Academic Integrity Policy states:

Sheridan College is committed to upholding the highest standards of academic integrity. The International Centre for Academic Integrity (ICAI) defines academic integrity as "a commitment, even in the face of adversity, to six fundamental values: honesty, trust, fairness, respect, responsibility, and courage. From these values flow principles of behavior that enable academic communities to translate ideals into action".

Applicants who are found to have falsified transcripts, cheated on admission tests, or submitted fraudulent documents or in any other way attempted to circumvent the admissions process in a manner inconsistent with the principles of academic integrity, will not be granted admission to the College. The applicant will be ineligible for admission to any Sheridan program or course for a period of not less than 5 years, after which admission to the College will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

For programs where a Statement of Intent is required as part of the admission process, the work should represent an applicant's own ideas, writing, projects and creations. Where others have contributed, or non-original ideas have been included, applicants will give proper recognition and reference. Applicants are not allowed to use advanced automated tools (artificial intelligence or machine learning tools such as ChatGPT) for written or visual components of portfolio submissions.

Additional Admissions Requirements

The deadline to submit your Statement of Intent for the first round of assessment is Thursday, February 22, 2024 10:00am EST. After this date, assessments will be made on a first-come, first-served basis for the remaining available seats.

The Additional Admission Requirement for the Bachelor of Film & Television is a Statement of Intent.

Statement of Intent

Your Statement of Intent should be an effective narrative of why you should be in the program. It should articulate your reasons for pursuing Sheridan's Bachelor of Film & TV (BFTV) Program by explicitly answering the following questions:

- How will Sheridan's BFTV Program help you reach your personal, artistic and professional goals?
- 2. What is important to you, personally and creatively?
- 3. Given that the film and TV industries are highly collaborative, describe an important collaborative experience you have had. What did you learn from that experience?

Your Statement of Intent submission must fall under <u>ONE</u> of the following types. There is no order of preference in this list, lengths stipulated are <u>maximum</u> allowable lengths. Submissions can be shorter.

- * If your submission is significantly shorter than the maximum length, it is recommended that you review the questions above and ensure that you have appropriately answered each of the questions."
- 1. **Written** Submission must be a maximum of 500 words (Times New Roman, 12pt font, double-spaced, in a PDF file).
- A 2-minute video Submission format must be a Vimeo or YouTube link. If the video is password protected, please provide the password. Put the link to the video, and password (if applicable), in a document and upload the PDF. Alternatively, you can submit your video directly into the online submission system with the "Upload Files" feature.
- 3. **A 2-minute audio clip** Submission format must be an MP3 file. Submit your audio clip directly into the online submission system with the "Upload Files" feature.
- 4. A slideshow Maximum of 10 slides. Submission can be a PowerPoint / Keynote slide deck, exported as a QuickTime movie, or a PDF file.

Additional Information

- This is a highly competitive program for which the number of eligible applications exceeds the number of qualified applicants required to fill the program.
- Classes for the Fall term begin Tuesday, September 3, 2024.
- Applicants will be selected on the basis of their previous academic achievement (in progress or completed) and the submission of a Statement of Intent.
- Notification of admissions decisions are made through email and the application portal.
 Decisions are not released over the phone.
