Program Eligibility

- A postsecondary diploma or degree in art and/or design or
- Demonstrated competence through a minimum of 2 years of relevant work experience

Credentials earned at less than the equivalent of an Ontario College Diploma will not be considered as having met the academic entrance requirements.

Selection Process for Applicants

Eligible applicants are selected on the basis of:

- <u>Portfolio</u> assessment
- Letter of Intent and Résumé

Applicants selected for the program will be notified through their Sheridan email account. Decisions will not be released over the phone. Fee, registration and timetable information will follow. Classes for the fall term begin September 2, 2025

You will be required to submit a <u>portfolio</u>, <u>résumé</u> and <u>letter of intent</u> online. The deadline to submit portfolios for the first round of assessment is February 21, 2025. After this date, assessments will be made on a first-come, first serve basis for the remaining available seats. It's in your best interest to upload your portfolio as soon as possible.

Academic Integrity

By submitting your Admission Requirements, you are agreeing to comply with Sheridan's Academic Integrity Policy. The Academic Integrity Policy states:

Sheridan College is committed to upholding the highest standards of academic integrity. The International Centre for Academic Integrity (ICAI) defines academic integrity as "a commitment, even in the face of adversity, to six fundamental values: honesty, trust, fairness, respect, responsibility, and courage. From these values flow principles of behavior that enable academic communities to translate ideals into action".

Applicants who are found to have falsified transcripts, cheated on admission tests, or submitted fraudulent documents or in any other way attempted to circumvent the admissions process in a manner inconsistent with the principles of academic integrity, will not be granted admission to the College. Those applicants will be ineligible for admission to any Sheridan program or course for a period of not less than 5 years, after which admission to the College will be reviewed on a case- by-case basis.

For programs where a portfolio submission is required as part of the admission process, portfolio work should represent an applicant's own ideas, writing, projects and creations. Where others have contributed, or non-original ideas have been included, applicants will give proper recognition and reference. Applicants are not allowed to use advanced automated tools (artificial intelligence or machine learning tools such as ChatGPT) for written or visual components of portfolio submissions.

Additional Admission Requirements

LETTER OF INTENT

- > Reply to the question: Why are you applying to this program?
- Maximum 500 words
- > PDF file

RÉSUMÉ

- Maximum 3 pages
- > PDF file

PORTFOLIO

(a) Required:

- Images of applicant's work (minimum of 5 and maximum of 20)
- > Each image file must be less than 5 MB
- Image file format: JPEG or PNG

and

Breakdown that should clearly explain the development process and work done by the applicant on each image/video submitted in portfolio

> PDF file

(b) Optional:

- Demo reel video file (2 minutes max)
- Video file must be less than 200 MB
- Video file format: MP4 or MOV

Guidelines:

- Include only visual pieces that demonstrates personal artistic achievements
- 2D software proficiency must be demonstrated in the portfolio (3D software knowledge is not required)
- Do not include 3D work unless it is used to show artistic abilities.
- Animation does not need to be included (2D or 3D)

Note:

• Portfolios will not be reviewed or critiqued by faculty before application.
