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Selection Process for Applicants

Eligible applicants are selected on the basis of their academic achievement (in progress or completed). Applicants who do not possess a Grade 11 or 12 Visual Arts credit at the (M) or (Open) level with a minimum of 65% will be required to submit a <u>portfolio</u>.

Applicants selected for the program will be notified by their Sheridan email account. These decisions will not be released over the phone. Fee, registration and timetable information will follow. Classes for each term will begin on the following dates:

Applicants who are required to submit a portfolio must do so online. It's in your best interest to apply and submit your portfolio as soon as possible, as seats in the program can fill quickly. Assessments will be made on a first-come, first serve basis for the remaining available seats.

Academic Integrity

By submitting your Admission Requirements, you are agreeing to comply with Sheridan's Academic Integrity Policy. The Academic Integrity Policy states:

Sheridan College is committed to upholding the highest standards of academic integrity. The International Centre for Academic Integrity (ICAI) defines academic integrity as "a commitment, even in the face of adversity, to six fundamental values: honesty, trust, fairness, respect, responsibility, and courage. From these values flow principles of behavior that enable academic communities to translate ideals into action".

Applicants who are found to have falsified transcripts, cheated on admission tests, or submitted fraudulent documents or in any other way attempted to circumvent the admissions process in a manner inconsistent with the principles of academic integrity, will not be granted admission to the College. Those applicants will be ineligible for admission to any Sheridan program or course for a period of not less than 5 years, after which admission to the College will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

For programs where a portfolio submission is required as part of the admission process, portfolio work should represent an applicant's own ideas, writing, projects and creations. Where others have contributed, or non-original ideas have been included, applicants will give proper recognition and reference. Applicants are not allowed to use advanced automated tools (artificial intelligence or machine learning tools such as ChatGPT) for written or visual components of portfolio submissions

Additional Admission Requirements

Applicants who do not possess a Grade 11 or 12 Visual Arts credit at the (M) or (Open) level with a minimum of 65% will be required to submit a portfolio consisting of a letter of intent, samples of work, and one document containing all the descriptions of each of the samples of work.

LETTER OF INTENT

(PDF, maximum 300 words)

Your letter of intent must include responses to the following:

- a. Why do you want to study Interior Decorating?
- b. Why do you want to study Interior Decorating at Sheridan College?
- c. Why are you a good candidate for this program?

Please ensure your responses are reflective of the Interior Decorating program and profession (not Interior Design). Follow standard letter of intent formatting and address to Sheridan College.

Your samples must include colour or black and white images of 10 pieces of your best work;

- 1 floor plan drawing with furniture (can be done with ruler/basic tools)
- 3 freehand sketches of still life
- 6 pieces may be a selection of: paintings, architectural drafting, renderings, AutoCAD drawings, perspectives, or other 2 or 3-dimensional creative works, which may be relevant to your application (i.e. photography, sculpture, etc.).
