Selection Process for Applicants

Eligible applicants for the full-time Intensive program will be selected on the basis of academic achievement, including a completed postsecondary diploma and/or degree with related courses. Applicants may be required to complete English testing to demonstrate proficiency.

Only those Applicants with an unrelated diploma or degree are required to submit documentation confirming 120 volunteer and/or paid hours. Postsecondary transcripts, indicating courses completed to date, must be submitted to ontariocolleges.ca at the time of application.

Applicants selected for the program will be notified by their Sheridan email account. Decisions will not be released over the phone. Information about fees, registration, course selection and obtaining the necessary documentation to start field placement in September will follow. You will be attending your field placement and your academic courses 5 full days a week. Classes for the fall term begin Tuesday, September 2, 2025.

Academic Integrity

By submitting your Admission Requirements, you are agreeing to comply with Sheridan's Academic Integrity Policy. The Academic Integrity Policy states:

Sheridan College is committed to upholding the highest standards of academic integrity. The International Centre for Academic Integrity (ICAI) defines academic integrity as "a commitment, even in the face of adversity, to six fundamental values: honesty, trust, fairness, respect, responsibility, and courage. From these values flow principles of behavior that enable academic communities to translate ideals into action".

Applicants who are found to have falsified transcripts, cheated on admission tests, or submitted fraudulent documents or in any other way attempted to circumvent the admissions process in a manner inconsistent with the principles of academic integrity, will not be granted admission to the College. Those applicants will be ineligible for admission to any Sheridan program or course for a period of not less than 5 years, after which admission to the College will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

For programs where a portfolio submission is required as part of the admission process, portfolio work should represent an applicant's own ideas, writing, projects and creations. Where others have contributed, or non-original ideas have been included, applicants will give proper recognition and reference. Applicants are not allowed to use advanced automated tools (artificial intelligence or machine learning tools such as ChatGPT) for written or visual components of portfolio submissions.

Additional Admission Requirements

Applicants with an unrelated diploma or degree must print, complete and submit the attached forms online through the [Sheridan Application Portal](#).

- Volunteer/paid Hours Verification form – to be completed by a Registered Early Childhood Educator (RECE) who has supervised the applicant in practice.
- Sheridan Confirmation of Volunteer Practical Hours Tracking form – to be completed by the applicant. Hours must be submitted in their entirety.

Early Childhood Education Intensive is a competitive program, and seats fill quickly. It's in your best interest to submit the required documents as soon as possible, no later than August 1, 2025¹. Emailed or faxed documents will not be accepted.

¹ Admission after August 1st: The ECE Intensive program requires all students to successfully complete two field placements: one in each semester. Applicants who receive offers of admission after August 1st can start in September, however, will not be eligible for the field placement in the Fall term. This delay will require the student to take their second field placement in a 3rd semester (May – August) to complete the program requirements.
