Academic Integrity

By submitting your Admission Requirements, you are agreeing to comply with Sheridan's Academic Integrity Policy. The Academic Integrity Policy states:

Sheridan College is committed to upholding the highest standards of academic integrity. The International Centre for Academic Integrity (ICAI) defines academic integrity as "a commitment, even in the face of adversity, to six fundamental values: honesty, trust, fairness, respect, responsibility, and courage. From these values flow principles of behavior that enable academic communities to translate ideals into action".

Applicants who are found to have falsified transcripts, cheated on admission tests, or submitted fraudulent documents or in any other way attempted to circumvent the admissions process in a manner inconsistent with the principles of academic integrity, will not be granted admission to the College. Those applicants will be ineligible for admission to any Sheridan program or course for a period of not less than 5 years, after which admission to the College will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

For programs where a portfolio submission is required as part of the admission process, portfolio work should represent an applicant's own ideas, writing, projects and creations. Where others have contributed, or non-original ideas have been included, applicants will give proper recognition and reference.

Additional Admission Requirements

After applying to the program, some applicants may be required to submit additional admission requirements online and will receive official submission instructions. It's in your best interest to apply as soon as possible.

To proceed with your application, you must submit a **Letter of Intent** online via your <u>Sheridan Application Portal</u>. It's in your best interest to submit your documentation as soon as possible.

LETTER OF INTENT

The Letter of Intent should be a well-written, persuasive, and grammatically correct pdf document (maximum 500 words). It must argue why you believe you are a good candidate for the Urban Design program and how the program will serve your future goals. It should include:

- The Urban Design Industry(ies) you are most interested in.
- How you expect this program will help you in achieving your career goals.
- Specific skills or knowledge you hope to gain from this program.
- Your employment/educational/extra-curricular/volunteer experiences related to Urban Design. Include your role in these endeavours and the timeline you were involved (bullet point format).

Additional Information

- **Program Eligibility:** Postsecondary Diploma, Advanced Diploma or Degree studies related to the "built environment" with a minimum overall GPA of 65%.
- Candidates to the program are selected on the basis of academic achievement in a "built
 environment". Individual applicants outside of the built environment field will be selected on
 the basis of academic achievement and the evaluation of a <u>Letter of Intent</u>, which includes
 volunteer/work experience that demonstrates their interest in the industry.
- Postsecondary transcripts, indicating courses completed to date, must be submitted to
 ontariocolleges.ca at the time of application. Domestic applicants with education outside of
 Canada must have their transcripts assessed for equivalency through <u>ICAS</u> or <u>WES</u>. A
 comprehensive (course-by-course) assessment is required.
- Notification of admissions decisions are made through email and the application portal.
 Decisions are not released over the phone.

Laptop program
